

Updates in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery

Prescription opioids, heroin and fentanyl use is increasing in the United States along with addiction overdose and death. More than 40 people per day die from overdoses from prescription opioids. This course reviews the history of the opioid epidemic while also looking at dentistry's role in the opioid epidemic. Management of acute dental and postoperative pain will be discussed along with safe prescribing techniques to avoid abuse and diversion. Other topics including benign pediatric pathology, management of odontogenic infections and oral trauma in the growing patient, and dental implants in the adolescent patient will be reviewed.
