Implant Impressions: Fabrication and Utilization of Custom Healing Abutments and Custom Impression Copings

Implant restorations should be one of the most predictable and profitable things you do in your practice. Set yourself up for success by utilizing custom healing abutments and custom impression copings whenever possible. Custom healing abutments create a more ideal emergence contour of soft tissue establishing a healthy and esthetic transition zone during the healing phase. Custom impression copings provide for a more predictable impression that captures actual soft tissue contours that enable the lab to duplicate that precise emergence in your restoration. Each step, including materials and methods, will be discussed while reviewing clinical cases where this approach was utilized.
